JESUS VS. ISSA

For the reasons below, it is obvious that Issa of the Qur'an is NOT the Jesus of the BIble:

The Qur'an Confuses the Trinity: Sura 5:116 = "And [beware the Day] when Allah will say, "O Jesus, Son of Mary, did you say to the people, 'Take me and my mother as deities besides Allah?'" He will say, "Exalted are You! It was not for me to say that to which I have no right"

Here you have Allah confusing the trinity, asking 'Issa' whether he and his mother Mary are to be worshipped. Why is Mary included in the trinity? Did God get confused, or was Issa including her alongside himself. Either way, this is not the trinity I know or worship.

The Qur'an Denies the Crucifixion: Sura 4:157 = "And [for] their saying, "Indeed, we have killed the Messiah, Jesus, the son of Mary, the messenger of Allah." And they did not kill him, nor did they crucify him; but [another] was made to resemble him to them"

Probably the greatest lie in the Qur'an, stipulating that the 'Issa' of the Qu'ran does not die on the cross, but another takes his place, thus damning us all for eternity!

The Qur'an Denies the Sonship of Jesus Christ: Sura 4:171 = "The Messiah, Jesus, the son of Mary, was but a messenger of Allah and His word which He directed to Mary and a soul [created at a command] from Him. So believe in Allah and His messengers. And do not say, "Three"; desist - it is better for you. Indeed, Allah is but one God. Exalted is He above having a son."

This verse not only rejects the trinity, but rejects the sonship of Jesus Christ, who is the Messiah, and stipulates that he was nothing more than a human messenger.

The Qur'an Denies the Incarnation of Jesus Christ: Sura 5:75 = "The Christ, son of Mary, was but an apostle: all [other] apostles had passed away before him; and his mother was one who never deviated from the truth; and they both ate food [like other mortals]."

The reasoning here is that since God does not eat like humans, and Issa ate, then that would preclude Issa being God, since that would suggest God had become a man

The Qur'an equates Jesus with Adam: Sura 3:59 "Indeed, the example of Jesus to Allah is like that of Adam. He created Him from dust; then He said to him, "Be," and he was."

Thus, Issa was like Adam, a created being formed out of the dust of the earth.

The Qur'an stipulates that Jesus came simply to introduce Muhammad: Sura 61:6 "And [mention] when Jesus, the son of Mary, said, "O children of Israel, indeed I am the messenger of Allah to you confirming what came before me of the Torah and bringing good tidings of a messenger to come after me, whose name is Ahmad."

Note: 'Ahmad' is the diminutive for Muhammad, thus Jesus was sent to introduce this one known as 'Ahmad', or Muhammad.

With these verses above it is clear that the Qur'an denies the Trinity, as well as the Sonship of Jesus, it denies His incarnation, and His Crucifixion, which therefore denies the atonement, and believes Jesus came simply to introduce Muhammad. I thus conclude that the Issa of the Qur'an is not my Jesus.
